Dear Pompton Lakes Resident:

The New Jersey Department of Health and Senior Services (NJDHSS) and the Agency for Toxic Substances and Disease Registry (ATSDR) have recently completed two health consultations related to the DuPont Pompton Lakes site. The first, "Analysis of the Vapor Intrusion Pathway in the Pompton Lakes Neighborhood Impacted by the DuPont Groundwater Contamination," provides information on the chemicals found in indoor air in some residences, and the health risks from exposures. The second is the "Analysis of Cancer Incidence in the Pompton Lakes Neighborhood Impacted by the DuPont Groundwater Contamination." A brief summary of each of the documents is enclosed.

In coordination with Mayor Katie Cole, the Department will hold a community meeting in January to present and discuss these reports. We expect to place them on our website, <http://www.state.nj.us/health/eoh/cehsweb/index.html> by the end of Friday, December 11, 2009. We will send printed copies to Mayor Cole's office as soon as we have them available.
